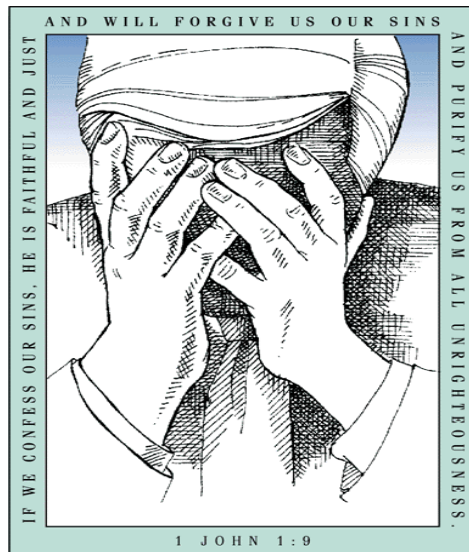

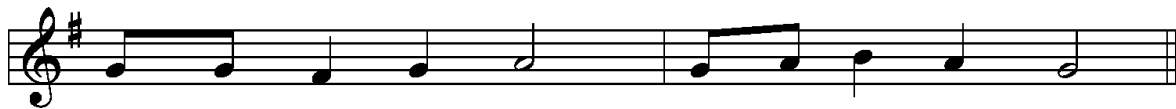

## Sharing of the Meal (Sacrament of the Altar)

All baptized Christians who believe that **Christ's body and blood are present with the bread and wine for the forgiveness of sins and the strengthening of faith** are welcome to receive this Meal. **We invite children to come forward to receive a blessing.** Please sign the Friendship Pad and check the "Taking Communion" box to register for communion.

+ Those worshipers desiring to receive Holy Communion will be ushered forward to the Communion Railing, where you will kneel at the signal of the Communion Assistant.

+ After receiving the bread (*the body of Christ*), you may receive the wine (*the blood of Christ*) either by **Intinction** (*dipping the bread into the cup to receive the wine*) or by drinking from the **Common Cup** (*if you are communing with the Common Cup, it is easier if you tilt it yourself*).

+ The **Intinction Cup** contains both wine and "fruit of the vine" grape juice for those not able to drink wine.

+ After you have communed please return to your seat, offering a **prayer of thanksgiving** to our **gracious God** for His love displayed in this sacrament.

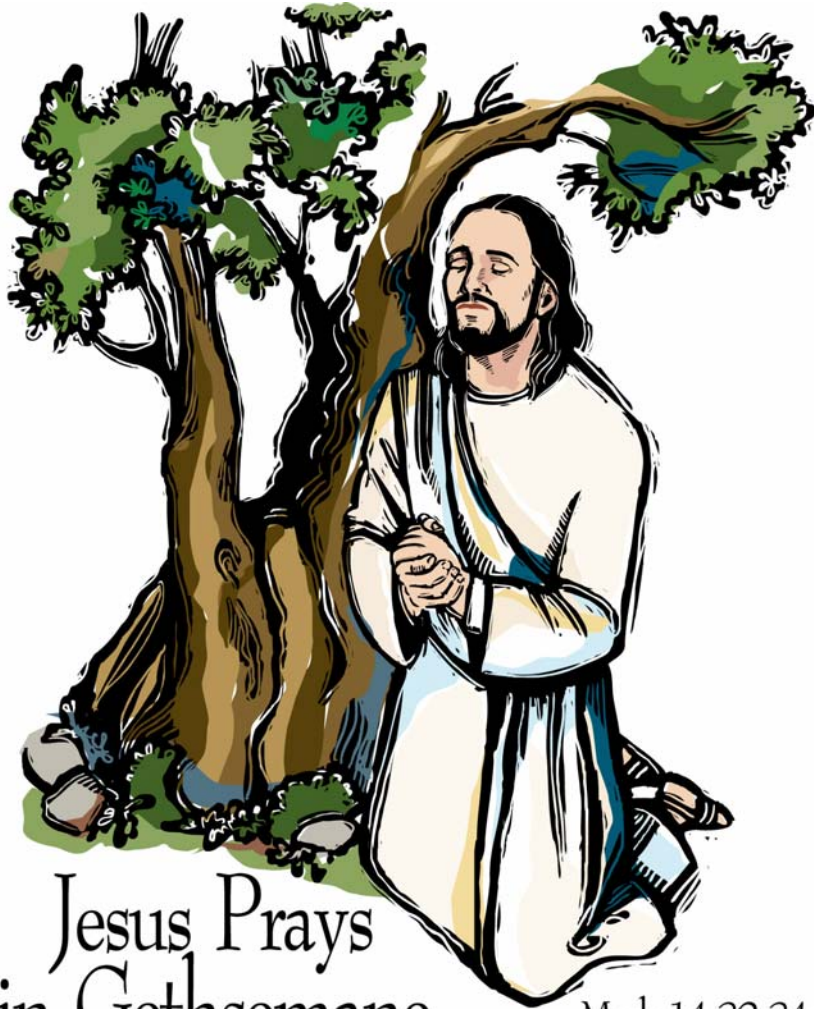
